



MOST KITES FLOWN SIMULTANEOUSLY

The following act as a guide to the specific considerations and undertakings, in addition to the general requirements as detailed in the General Rules of the Record Breakers' Pack, for any potential attempt on the above record.

They should be read and understood by all concerned – organisers, participants and witnesses – prior to the event.

Please note that, as detailed in the Agreement Regarding Record Attempts, these guidelines in no way provide any kind of safety advice or can be construed as providing any comfort that the record is free from risk.

GUIDELINES

The record for the most kites flown simultaneously is based on greatest number of kites airborne at one time at the same location.

- 1 - Each participant must be flying one kite only. It is not permissible for one person to be controlling more than one kite.
- 2 - In the keeping with the spirit of the activity, each kite must be airborne as the result of wind flow rather than being dragged by the kite flier and it must be on a minimum of ten feet string (from hand to kite body).
- 3 - All the kites should be in the air for at least 30 seconds for the record to be valid.
- 4 - Attendance numbers are confirmed by individuals signing their own names once only on a form witnessed by two independent persons. No 'ditto' marks are accepted.
- 5 - Sufficient witnesses should be involved to ratify that all the contestants fully participate in the attempt - witnesses should be placed in such a way that every part of the record attempt area is visible to the officials. Participants who weren't able to fly their kites for the required 30 seconds should be deducted from the total.
- 6 - Kites of any design or type may be used in this record attempt.
